

























The role of rural cooperatives is important for the Republic of Armenia since agriculture is one of the key fields of economic development of the country and is the main source of income for the majority of rural population.

Cooperatives create an opportunity to increase the income of farmers in the conditions of shortage of agricultural land, lack of adequate infrastructure, lack of access to qualified agroprocessing and agronomic specialized services, product sales and other difficulties.

Our experience shows that inclusive rural cooperatives contribute to poverty reduction, job creation, employment, and to the increase of income from agriculture. Farmers' joint efforts help to get knowledge and skills, to find investments and to mobilize resources.

The RA Law "On Agricultural Cooperatives" was as a positive change in 2015, but it was necessary to revise other related legal acts to achieve significant results. The latter is not happening and, as a result, most of the registered agricultural cooperatives are not functioning, while the development of agricultural cooperatives is one of the government's priorities.

Although we managed to improve the tax regualtion field for the activities of the consumer cooperatives operating in the villages, the agricultural cooperatives continue to be viewed by the state as ordinary businesses, and are therefore not operating. Taking into account the dual role of cooperatives as a «union» and «social enterprise», legislation should provide such guarantees that individuals can fully exercise their right to freedom of association. The Legislation should take into account the peculiarities of cooperatives and their positive contribution to the improvement of their members' live and communities' well-off.

Based on the evident truth that inclusive cooperatives contribute to economic and social integration of people, as well as protection of their rights, Shen NGO in line with other activities will continue to advocate the interests of farmers working jointly in the villages in the coming years.




